## To Ride To Give 2026.

Ride To Give has become something powerful because people like you keep showing up. You ride hard, dig deep and believe that a few big days on the bike can create long-term change well beyond the road.

What began more than a decade ago has now raised over \$4.5 million, fueled by shared purpose, strong partnerships and a community that backs regional young people where it matters most.

This year isn't about looking back — it's about building on that momentum and pushing it even further.

Over the next few days, you'll ride through regional towns and landscapes that remind us why this ride exists in the first place. You'll connect with local communities, hear first-hand stories of impact and see the difference your commitment makes for our charity partners, Boys to the Bush and BackTrack Youth Works.

There will be challenges — long days, tired legs, early starts — but there will also be laughter, mateship, quiet moments on the road and that unbeatable feeling of finishing something meaningful together.

None of this happens without you — or the people standing behind you. Together, we ride with purpose, ride together and give back in a way that truly matters.

Strap in, look out for one another and enjoy the journey.

# Charity Partners

**BOYS** TO THE **BUSH**

**On a mission to assist boys to become good men.**

Last year on this ride, you met Beau and Sue Brown. You saw what happens when consistent support wraps around a young man who was heading down the wrong path.

Beau was caught up in drugs, poor choices and a lifestyle that was only going one way. Through Boys to the Bush MENToring — and because of you — he got back in the gym, got off drugs, rebuilt his discipline and started stepping up as a positive member of his community.

But here's the hard reality.

When his funded MENToring finished around the time of last year's ride, the structured, weekly support ended. We've still checked in. We're still in his corner. We don't walk away from our boys. But without dedicated funding and consistent face-to-face MENToring, the

intensity of support reduces — and Beau no longer has a funded place in the program.

Since then, he's begun slipping back into recreational drug use and old habits.

This is what many of our boys face. Progress is fragile. They return to the same environments and pressures that haven't changed.

So this year, we ride to make sure support doesn't thin out when funding runs out.

We ride to secure two more terms of MENToring for Beau — to tighten the circle around him, to bring back consistency, accountability and belief.

Because sometimes knowing someone is still there isn't enough — sometimes they need us right beside them.



### Recap of funding so far.

When you ride, boys stay connected.

In 2024, because you got on the bike, we secured a permanent base in Forbes and expanded our capacity with buses and a boat. That means more camps, more outreach, more time in the bush, and more safe spaces where boys disconnected from school and community can reset, rebuild and reconnect.

In 2025, you kept 35 boys in consistent, year-long MENToring. Not short-term support. Not a quick fix. Real consistency. You also made it possible for us to step in for boys who had no other services around them — boys who would have otherwise been missed. Because of you, they were reconnected to school, to training, to work, and to their communities.

You also helped put vehicles on the road so our MENTors can reach boys when things escalate and stay alongside the **on the ride, we get to show up for them — week after week.**

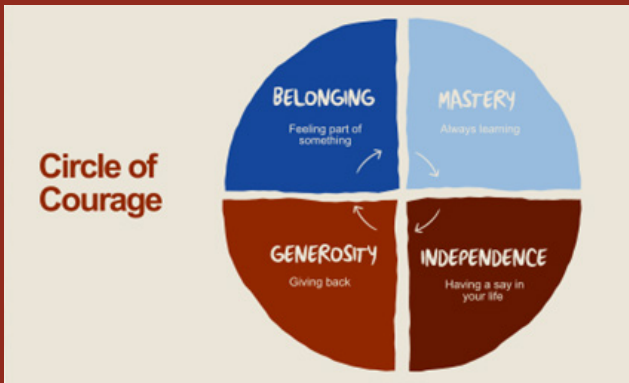

## A word from BackTrack's lead rider...

When BackTrack first took ownership of our own farm, Cubba Cubbah, in late 2023, it marked a shift to very long-term thinking. When you're responsible for land you start thinking in generations rather than years.

This happened to coincide with our first involvement as beneficiaries of Ride to Give. FDC and all of the riders from 2023 and 2025 have been critical foundational donors to the BackTrack farm. In 3 short years, you have made our dream of creating a place of belonging and refuge for young people doing it tough a reality. With your support we've been able to install 2 donated cabins and operate these as respite and emergency accommodation for our young people in the wide open space of Cubba Cubbah.

BackTrack Works young people and our amazing Trades Supervisors have been able to fully renovate the falling down farmhouse – which is already running as a full time accommodation option for BackTrack young people, and, together with our main house and tiny homes at Warrah, is offering dozens of kids the safe and stable home environment they need to engage in all of BackTrack's lifechanging education, training and employment programs.

We learnt early on in our 20 year history that a safe place to stay is absolutely integral – and that's why we set up Warrah, which was once our Founder Bernie's, family home.

It now has 10 beds for young people in the main house and 4 tiny homes which allow the older ones to transition into independent living. Your donations helped keep it running in 2025.

We have countless stories of impact on young people in those 3 short years: learning to read, to drive, to cook a healthy meal, to stay out of trouble, to stay calm. Getting a white card, connecting with our dogs, being part of something bigger. On the individual scale you have helped these kids break the cycles of incarceration and disadvantage; giving them a home, employment pathways, literacy skills and the confidence that will change their lives forever. Most of all – your support shows them that they have people cheering them on from the sidelines as they ride up the tough hills they find themselves stuck on, through no fault of their own.

In the longer view, now that the farm is off the ground, we are also mapping out the difference we can make way out in front. Because every farm needs a succession plan. Over the last 3 years we have been nurturing the incredible young leaders who have been through our programs over many years and are now ready to give back. They will be the future custodians of Cubba Cubbah, and of the BackTrack legacy – carrying on our unique culture and our very long ride for generations to come. That puts some extra power and inspiration in our pedals.

Your efforts make all these things possible.

On behalf of the BackTrack crew – kids, staff and Board – we want to thank you all. We'll be cheering you on over these next few days.

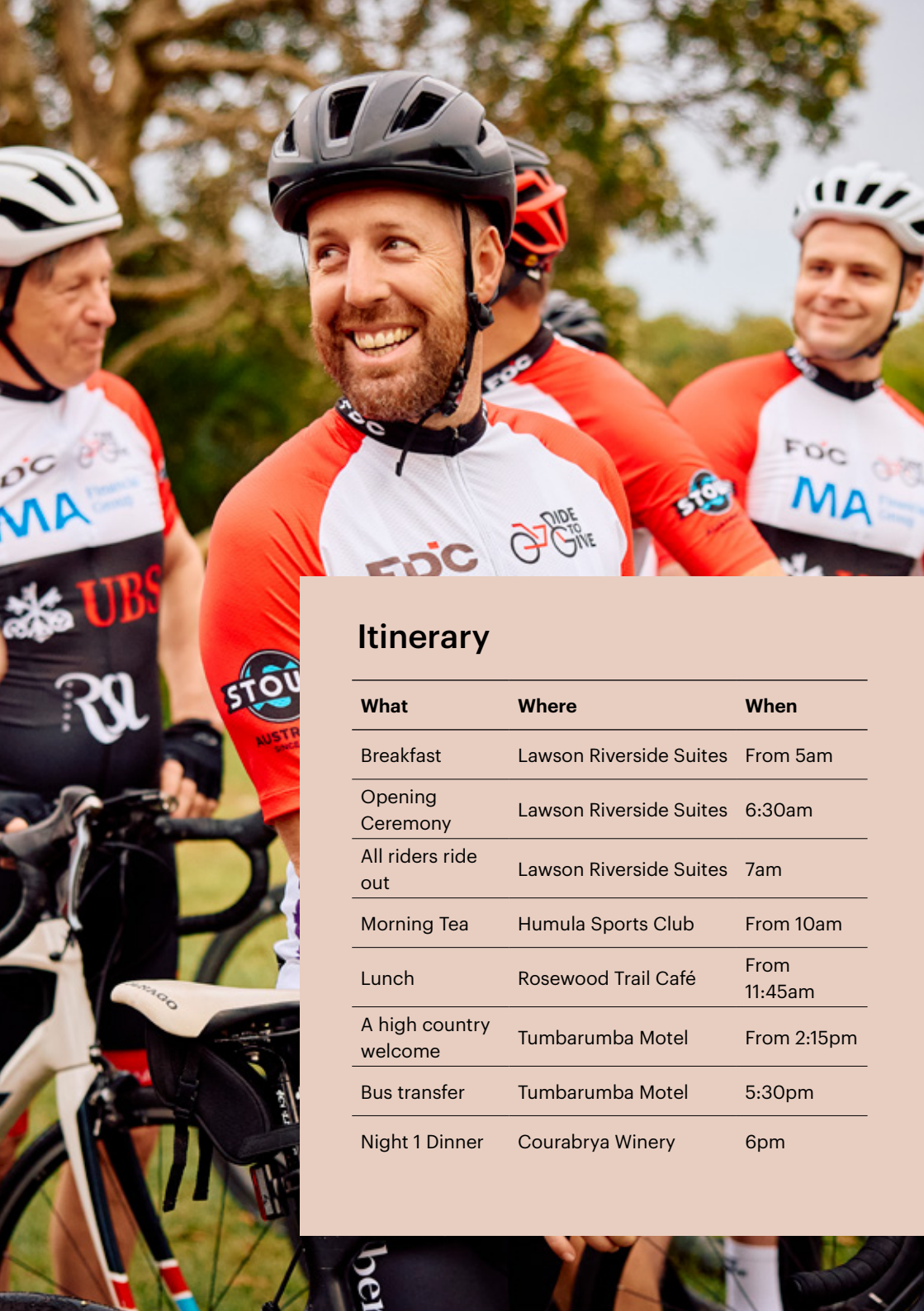

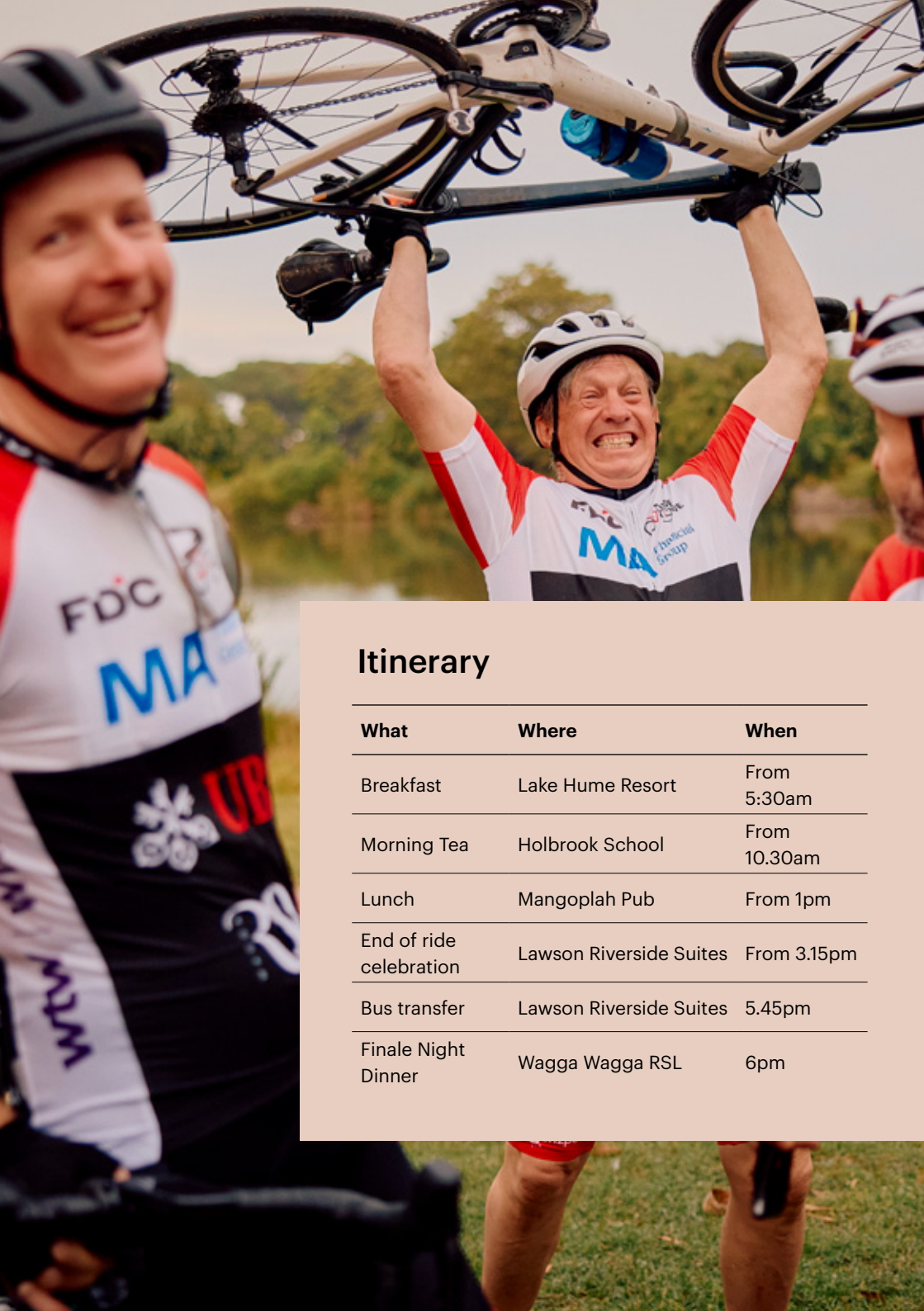

# Pelotons

## Peloton Grading

Pelotons are graded by average speed, and riders must stay together—no one can ride the route without support. If you're struggling to keep up, let your captain know; you can rest in a support vehicle if needed.

Ride captains lead each peloton, and all riders are expected to follow their directions and support fellow cyclists along the way.



## Peloton Support Vehicles

Each peloton has two support cars ensuring a safe and smooth ride:

### Lead Car

Stays ahead, stocked with water, electrolytes, gels, muesli bars, bananas, and day bags to keep you fueled.

### Rear Car

Follows behind with first aid, a paramedic, and mechanical support to handle any issues on the road.

## Ride Captains & Communication

Each peloton has two FDC ride captains and an Entoure mechanic to provide guidance, motivation, and bike support. They stay in constant communication with both support vehicles to ensure safety and assistance when needed.

With a dedicated team by your side, ride with confidence, support each other, and enjoy the journey!

## Chunking

When riding long distances, divide the day into smaller segments. Focus on reaching your morning tea and lunch stops, rather than thinking about the entire distance. This makes the ride feel more achievable and keeps you motivated along the way.

# Logistics

## Meals & Road Fuel

All meals, snacks, and drinks are provided, including coffee, tea, and cold beverages. A beer or wine is included at the end of each day—any extra alcohol is at your own cost, so bring cash or card.

### Hydration & Electrolytes

Staying hydrated is essential. Electrolyte needs vary, but everyone should keep their levels topped up. We'll provide SIS Electrolyte tablets—just add 1 per 500ml bottle.

Drink responsibly and stay hydrated throughout the ride!

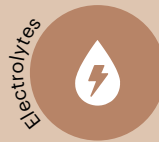
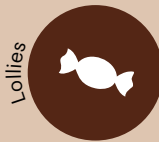
## Refuel Stops

Peloton captains will schedule stops every 60–90 minutes, but if you need one sooner, just ask. Stops will be in safe areas, with headcounts and a countdown to departure. Re-enter the road safely, check for traffic, and regroup quickly.

At breaks, refill bottles and use the bathroom first—don't wait until the last minute. **Never** lean bikes on peloton cars. Follow instructions to keep the ride smooth and safe.

## Laundry

Laundry facilities may not always be available, so it's best to wash and dry your kit in your room each afternoon to ensure it's ready for the next day. The logistics team have some laundry powder should you need it. A gentle scrub in the shower makes a big difference—your fellow riders will appreciate it! Bring a coat hanger for easy drying.

## Baggage

We've got your bags covered – no need to worry! We'll be transporting them between locations. Make sure your bag has your luggage tag secured. Don't lose that tag!

Here's the daily routine:

### Morning:

- **Pack your bag** – check for toiletries, chargers, and anything else you might have used.
- **Drop off** – put your bag under the sign for the **corresponding hotel for the next town**. This will help our team immensely and ensure your bag gets to your hotel room.
- Don't forget to follow support team instructions on where to leave your room key!

### Afternoon:

- When you arrive, **grab your room key** from the support team.
- Our luggage lads would have placed your bags in your hotel room already.

Our support crew is here to make sure everything runs smoothly, but if you're ever confused, just ask! Since your bags will be bouncing around on a truck, **don't pack anything too valuable or fragile.**

Let's keep it easy – just pack smart, drop, pick up, and ride on!

# Logistics

## Road Safety

### Entoure Cycling Event Management

Kent Williams from Entoure is back for another year! Kent has been working dilligently with all councils, police and traffic management committees to ensure the route and roads we are travelling are safe and approved.

### Peloton Riding

Riding in a group requires extra attention and coordination to ensure everyone's well-being. Here are some key guidelines to follow:

- **Maintain a Steady Pace:** Keep a consistent speed and avoid sudden braking or acceleration.
- **Communicate Clearly:** Use hand signals and verbal cues to indicate turns, stops, and hazards. Clear communication is essential for the safety of the entire peloton.
- **Stay Alert:** Always be aware of your surroundings and the riders around you. Keep an eye out for obstacles, traffic, and changes in the road.
- **Ride Predictably:** Hold your line and avoid weaving. Predictable riding helps others anticipate your movements and maintain a safe distance.
- **Respect the Lead Rider:** Follow the lead rider's pace and signals. The lead rider sets the tempo and direction for the group.
- **Keep a Safe Distance:** Maintain a safe following distance to allow for reaction time. Avoid overlapping wheels with the rider in front of you.

Let's work together to make this a successful and memorable event.

## Medical Team

Your safety is always our number one priority.

FDC has once again engaged Highlands First Aid as our medical partner for this ride. The team at Highlands specialise in medical support for organised events and has done a spectacular job for us in the past.

We will have one medic assigned to each Peloton, who will always travel in the rear support vehicle. We have provided any known pre-existing medical conditions noted on registrations to the team at Highlands.

Should you have any concerns at any stage of the event, please see the Highlands team immediately.

Your health and safety are of utmost importance to us.

## Uplifts

We have uplifts on day 1 and 3 for our P3 riders. We are grateful to have the support of both a mini bus from BttB and Mike from Tumut freight will join us again with his truck.

The approximate location of these uplifts are noted in the Ride with GPS links.

For each uplift, your bike will be transported by our good friend, Mike. We have packing blankets for your bikes to minimise scratches during travel.

## Mechanics

We're excited to say that Entoure will once again be providing Ride Captains and Mechanics throughout the ride! Each peloton will have its very own Entoure Captain. While our Ride Captains will be ready for day-to-day repairs, we encourage all riders to bring two tubes and carry them just in case you get a flat tire in the unlikely event you are away from the main pack.

To ensure a smooth ride, please make sure your bike has been recently serviced and is in top condition.

Here are our recommendations:

- Fresh tires and tubes.
- Spare cleats for your cycling shoes.
- Spare spokes for wheels.
- Battery charger if you use electronic gears (and don't forget to charge before you depart!).
- Front and rear lights for your bike. The mornings are early and the sun may not be up. Don't forget your charger also!

Remember, service during the event is free of charge, but parts will be charged to the rider on a user-pays basis.

## Insurance & Personal Membership

This Event has been sanctioned by Cycling Australia and as such, it will be **mandatory** for all to be members of Cycling Australia to participate.

If you are not already a member of Cycling Australia and do not have any cycling related insurance, please visit [www.auscycling.org.au](http://www.auscycling.org.au) membership to become a member and be insured prior to the Ride. Your safety is our absolute priority.

For those that have never been a Cycling Australia Member or haven't been a member for 2 years or longer, you can sign up to a 4-week trial which will cover you for the duration of the ride: <https://auscycling.org.au/become-a-member/free-trial>.



Note: Lifestyle Basic is not enough coverage. Minimum requirement is the Lifestyle Insurance.

By participating in a Cycling Australia sanctioned event you acknowledge and accept the risk associated with cycling on open roads and engage in the Event at your own risk.

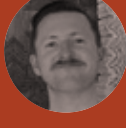

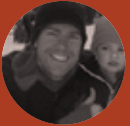
